## Year-end Treasurer Report, Submitted by: Angela Cranston

## 1) Unpaid ice rental fees from March 2020

Due to Covid and the closure of the rec centre on March 12<sup>th</sup> 2020, we came to an agreement with CRCA and paid them \$15,000 in 2021 for a portion of the ice fees that would have been paid for playoffs for the remainder of March 2020.

## 2) Refunds & Receivables

Refunds were paid to all members due to the season ending early. Refunds were calculated based on a variable cost (amount of ice used by each team) plus a fixed cost (with the same fixed cost being allocated to each player in the organization). This was a very time-consuming process & I would like to thank everyone that helped me get these refunds out in a timely manner. There was only \$355 of accounts receivables that was not collected this season.

## 3) Development Account

A development bank account was opened for the March & April development sessions. There is currently \$3,138.10 remaining in this account after all revenues and expenses were recorded.

## 4) Operating & Shorthanded Account

There is currently \$115,821.40 remaining in our Operating account and there is \$9,254.48 in our Shorthanded account.

## 5) Casino funds & Fundraising accounts

The casino funds were received on May 11<sup>th</sup> of 2020 for \$37,702.66. No other fundraising was done this year due to Covid & therefore all the casino funds were spent this season on ice fees & coach's courses and safety training reimbursements. There is a remaining balance of \$447.20 in our casino and gaming accounts.

## 6) Treasurers Assistant position

Due to the amount of work the Treasurer position entails, this position has been split into two & a Treasurers Assistant position has been created.

Hosted two sessions for each age group of CMHA goalies with GDI Goaltender. Good feedback. Recommend using them again for development. Plan in place to train coaches as well.


## **Coach Evaluations**

June 22, 2021

COVID conditioning and tryouts open to all U13 players in late August, early September. No parents were allowed for evaluations until the end. 53 players registered.

Modified the evaluation schedule due to COVID-19 to 3 prep skates, 1 skill ice time, 1 goalie session, 3 cohort evaluation scrimmages. There was not tournament for final evaluations. All the evaluators had no kids in the AA program.

Final team roster was 17 CMHA players and 0 imports.

Were only able to play 2 exhibition games against Wheatland where they were 1 and 1.

- Team kicked off the season with a scavenger hunt and outdoor barbeque.
- October 31 team put together Halloween goodie bags with donated candy to all the younger teams who were quarantined and could not go trick or treating.
- Coaches came in on their own time and painted dressing room.
- November to February coaches held weekly zoom meetings and scheduled weekly zoom workouts with Chestermere Speed School.
- February 18 March 30 we booked development ice and had 14 of our 17 players attend.
- April 15 we hosted a virtual "Open House" with a Power Point presentation Blaine had put together along with a video from Todd's daughter and sent invites to all potential U13 parents. Was successful.
- June 10 August 19 the coaches are doing a Summer Camp for U13 players. 27 players attending in 2 groups.

We are going to continue to do the Open House in late March early April and the summer camp to help promote the AA program.

I would like to thank the coaching staff (Blaine, Todd, Tyson, & Josh) who went well above and beyond this season with all they did and continue to do beyond just coaching.

Obviously with the arrival of COVID-19, a number of our processes of procedures were amended to accommodate our new environment, which will be covered shortly hereafter.

### **Equipment and Apparel Provider - Eight33 SFS Medicine Hat**

CMHA entered the first year with our new Apparel provider, Eight33 SFS, Medicine Hat. All things considering, the delivery quality and customer service was top notch. We were able to continue our typical process and procedures with our product line up and ordering procedures. Eight33 was able to add the ability to view and track all products from the date of order to the delivery date. Understanding that our provider is located in Medicine Hat, it worked well to have all products couriered directly to the individual customer.

### Jerseys

For the 2020/21 season it was determined that as an Association would not purchase any additional Bauer game jerseys and that CMHA would not issue any game jerseys for this season only. Therefore, reversible jerseys were provided to each player except to those who were in the U5 and U11 age levels (Timbits and McDonalds provide jerseys for these specific age groups). The reversible jerseys were the property of the player. In addition, the players were able to select a number of their choice along with having a name bar on their jerseys. Lastly, the crest of the jersey had our 30th Anniversary logo to commemorate the event.

We are planning to return to our process of issuing game jerseys to all of our teams.

### Game Socks

As a prudent cost measure, CMHA only provided 1 set of game socks for the season. The second set of socks have been stored for the 2021/22 season and we are planning to return to providing a set of home and away game socks to our program.

### **TimBits**

2020 was our year to order new TimBit jerseys for our U5 program, we made a decision not to order new jerseys to reduce any financial stress to the local franchisee. We are planning to order new jerseys for the program in July 2021.

For information purposes, TimBits allows CMHA to order jerseys every 2 years.

### AtoMc Jerseys



We are entering our 3rd year in the AtoMc hockey jersey program and are very grateful for their donation of player/coaches toques, dry erase boards, 2 sets of game jerseys and socks.

In order to reduce stress on our CMHA jersey inventory, the entire U11 teams were issued AtoMc game jerseys, which in return provides an additional 100 jerseys for our U13 and older teams. It is planned to continue to issue the AtoMc jerseys for the near future.

### 30th Anniversary Logo

To commemorate our 30th Anniversary, we used our original logo from 1990 with some modern updates.

As next season approaches there will be discussion how and when we use this logo.

### A Look Forward to 2021/22

We are planning a return of normalcy in reference to our equipment and apparel for the upcoming season. In general terms, the overall inventory for equipment and jerseys is in great condition and with very minimal areas that require financial commitment. The board is not planning on purchasing any additional Bauer jerseys for the upcoming season and instead will focus on filling any gaps with our training equipment, ie: pylons, pucks and other training specific equipment.

The CMHA Team and Apparel stores will launch later this summer with little to no changes to our apparel line up. We are anticipating that there will be some increases to our apparel pricing due to the economic environment we are currently in.

Outside what was mentioned, we do not anticipate any major changes or surprises for the upcoming season.



June 11, 2021

The season started off with conditioning, skills and games for all U9 players in early September with the final game being played early October.

We had 2 conditionings, 2 skill ice time and 2 evaluation games.

Final team roster was 83 CMHA players. We had 6 teams, 2 with 13 players, 3 with 14 players and 1 with 15 players.

We had two 1-hour ½ ice practices a week.

CAHL sent out the team cohorts to the team managers with the timeline that they needed to book 1 home and 1 away game with each team. It was up to the team managers and ice directors to then find ice time and schedule the games. This ended up being a lot of work as some teams where trying to schedule home and away games with 2 other teams in the same 14-day period.

Season ended just after game play got started so most teams only had 2 or 3 games total.
