• Strategy Brainstorming (ideas only – not confirmed plans).

• U5 Age Division

- Currently, Sunday afternoons at 10:30am; discussion to adjust the time to accommodate other kids.
- Generally, 30 registrants in years past; 18/19 registrant for the last two years. Maybe due to Covid.
- Learn to skate program under Tiny Mites title. Market the program as a teaching tool for kids to get playing hockey.
- For players aged 4.
- Open to Calgary, Indus, Strathmore.
- Work with the skate shop for gear exchange.
- Push on skating; get more specialty coaches for this age group.

• U7 Age Division

- Complaints for ice times.
 - Discussion on ice restrictions in Chestermere.
 - Potential to get ice from other arenas and have a start time for U7 in Chestermere at 7:30am the earliest.
- Potential of having an inter-regional play with Indus/Strathmore.
 - 2 teams of 20 at Indus.
 - ✤ 4 teams of 13 at Chestermere.
- All girls team option.
- Canadian Tire First Shift program to get more players (<u>https://www.firstshift.ca/</u>).
- Apply for a City of Chestermere grant as an intro to hockey.
- Push on skating; get more specialty coaches for this age group.

• U9 Age Division

Lots of feedback from the U9 division this year.

- Complaints on no tiering
- Complaints on having four tier C.



- Complaints on schedule. Teams losing ice times compared to other teams.
 Chestermere teams are very even, and competitive.
- CAHL and Hockey Alberta need to provide more direction. Wasting half a sheet of ice every ice time.
- Discussion with Indus on an Inter-regional play. Potential to go under Hockey Alberta's new "Rec League" and have teams make exhibition games for the whole season. Discussion to have "A" team that goes to CAHL. Other teams go could potential go to inter-regional.
- Push on skating; get more specialty coaches for this age group.

o U11 / U13 Age Division

- Practice option: play one week with ½ ice on week, next week play full ice on one day and dry land the next week. Each team would have an extra dryland.
- Practice option: extend ice time to 1h 30m; 30 minutes solo, 30 minutes together, 30 minutes solo. (Where would this extra 30 minutes come from?).
- Goalies:
 - Goalie Day at the end of the season for U9 and U11. Dave is arranging.
 - Potential to sign out gear.
 - Not a lot of goalies:
 - U11 rotating goalies and not declaring goalies.
 - Offer a \$500 credit/reimbursement for goalies to help with the cost of gear.
 - Get CMHA goalie masks decal with CMHA design.
 - No RHL for U11 and U13 this year. There were a lot of new players.
- U13AA prime ice times complaint.
 - Elite team could do early ice times.
 - Promote AA team with good ice times.
- New to hockey players
- Is there a way to overage players to the division below?

U15 Age Division

- Top tiers are contact; tier 4 and below is non-contact. CAHL made a decision this season to have the tier 4 team bumped up to tier 3 as a contact team (which was requested by coach & manager).
 - Contact or non-contact option = CAHL vs RHL
 - CAHL non-contact tiers.
- Better training for body contact (body checking clinic).
 - Issues with players trickling in after AA and AAA evaluations.
 - Discussion to have the players completing the final cuts placed on the 1 team.

• U18 Age Division

- Hockey Alberta is going to be getting a decision for U18 non-contact.
- Better training for body contact (body checking clinic), especially for the players who have never played contact.
- Large roster sizes two years in a row. Issues with players trickling in after AA and AAA evaluations.
- Discussion to merge with Indus for U18 age division (was done 3 seasons ago). Indus is discussing.

\circ Coaches

- This season, there were many coach suspensions in CAHL.
 - Potentially some ref training leading to higher suspensions in U11.
 - Get a few coaches specially trained through Hockey Alberta.
- Learn from specialty coaches when they are on the ice with the teams.

Give coaches resources and information on escalation policy (add to coaching manual). Defining team rules. Role clarity.

• Longest Hockey Game

- CMHA Booth.
- Fundraising
 - Fundraising should be based on an amount per player and based on division.
 - There should be a recommended amount of fundraising that should be dedicated to player development.
- \circ Evaluations
 - Discussion on external evaluations due to perceived notion that there is bias.
 - Cost prohibitive to hire external companies (\$18,000 quote).
 - ✤ A big undertaking to organize with another association.
 - Percentage of players that may be on the wrong team: 10/450 = -2%
 - More details should be communicated to parents
 - Flyer printed and provided to parents at evaluations.
 - Add graphic on the CMHA bulletin board.
 - 2022 Evaluation Strategy
 - Coordinators different division for evaluations
 - Software Continue to use Once Click. Their support is excellent and cost is reasonable.
 - Ice Meet with Ice Director in Summer to start the evaluation ice schedule
 - Concession Tab Continue with this for the evaluators
 - Equipment Meet with Hockey Development Director / Equipment Director in August to sort pucks and pylons
 - Speed Testing 2022
 - ✤ 2022 Changes
 - Different drills for Defense than Forwards
 - Different division will require helpers on ice
 - \circ $\;$ Watching to make sure the kids do it properly
 - Evaluators:
 - Group of evaluators will evaluate defense (both teams)
 - Group of evaluators will evaluate forwards (both teams)
 - Meeting for evaluators before sessions start to go over the ask for 2022
 - Potential for evaluators to watch AA Games and learn what the AA team is looking for
 - Target 10 Evaluators / game U13 and up
