Rec Hockey	

Recommendation if ice continues to be an issue

Hockey Alberta changed the options for registration a couple of years ago and a rec registration was added. I see this as a possible way to alleviate some of our ice problem.

I would like to discuss the possibility of creating a rec league with Strathmore and Indus like is done for youth baseball. I just don't understand the amount of travelling some teams have to do especially when some of the games are not competitive.

My proposal would be as follows:(open to suggestions and ideas as this a first cut)

- Each division would have 2/3 CAHL. Process same as current teams,
- Remaining players would be drafted to the rec teams by the coaches of those teams. Number of teams depends on number of players,
- A schedule would be made with Strathmore and Indus for games,
- CAHL would be 2 practices/week and 2 games/week,
- Rec teams would be 1 or 2 practice/week and 1 game/week,

We would control this league and be able to make rules based on development and fun, with reduced expense to our families.

## Lots to discuss:

- possibility of two tiers for the rec league,
- possible new hockey player division where age is not the determining factor for being on the team

- additional skill development ice times for those wishing to push their improvement
- reseeding players during the season (rec only)
- freedom for goalies to play out or player to try goalie whenever we wish
- rec league could schedule weeks with no games to give families a break

Meeting with the City of Chestermere	

Attended multiple meetings with the City of Chestermere.

Topic of concern was lack of available ice in the community

City would like to own the rec centre and run it as a city facility with appropriate funding – Recommend the CMHA supports this direction. Could help with cost of ice and more maintenance for the building.

Proposed Sprung Structures at an alternative City site as a temporary solution to the ice shortage.

The City took it to Council and approved a deeper look into it as an option. Possibly 2 ice surfaces.

Recommendation – follow up with the City to see how the Sprung Structure option is proceeding. Continue working with the City for additional ice in our community and to secure ice if a new facility is built.
